- B. Do not display the fixed image for extended periods of time.
- C. Turn the power off when not in actual use.

### **Important Information Regarding Use of Video Games, Computers, Captions or Other Fixed Image Displays.**

Do not allow a still picture to be displayed for an extended period, as this can cause a permanent after-image to remain on the screen.

Examples of still pictures include logos, video games, computer images, teletext and images displayed in 4:3 mode.

This product is not designed to display fixed images for extended periods of time.

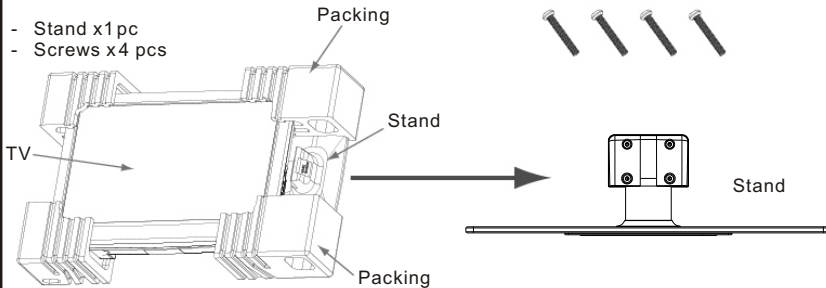
## STAND INSTALLATION GUIDE

This STAND INSTALLATION GUIDE is provided to help you easily install the stand. Please carefully follow Step 1 through Step 3.

### 1 Open the box and find the parts

Open the box and find the following parts.

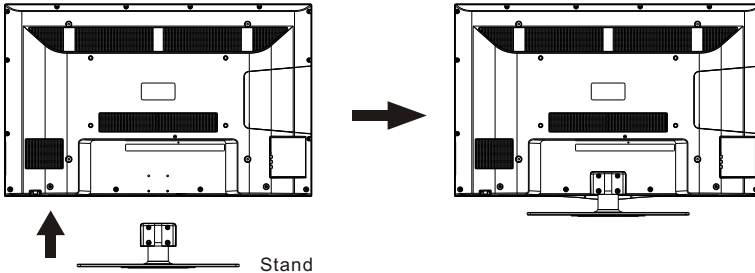
- Stand x1 pc

### 2 Place the Stand on the TV

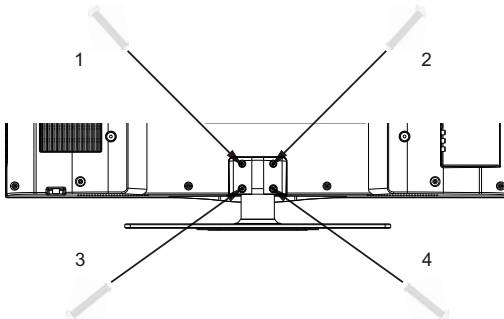
1. Place the TV with the display side down on a table or desk (flat, totally clean surface). Use a cloth or soft towel between the face of the TV and the table to protect the TV's screen.

2. Place the Stand on the TV as shown below. Align the holes in the stand with the holes in the TV.



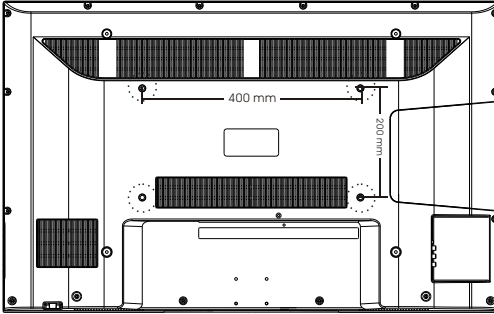
### 3 Secure the Stand to the TV

Secure the Stand to the TV by using the 4 supplied screws.

## Wall Mounting Holes Spacing and Locations



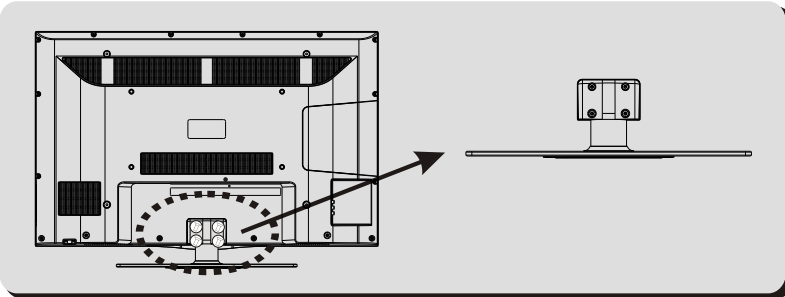
- 1) Remove the base stand by following the instructions below.
- 2) Use the four M4 screws provided to fix the TV onto a suitably strong wall mounting bracket (not included). The M4 screws are tightened into the four VESA-standard holes on the back of the television.

## Base Stand Disassembly Instructions

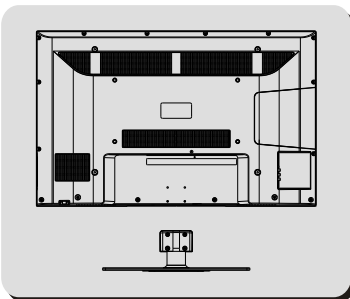
How to remove the stand from the TV



(The LCD Display is very fragile, and must be protected at all times when removing the base stand. Be sure that no hard or sharp object, or anything that could scratch or damage the LCD display, comes into contact with it. DO NOT exert pressure on the front of the unit at any time because the screen could crack.)



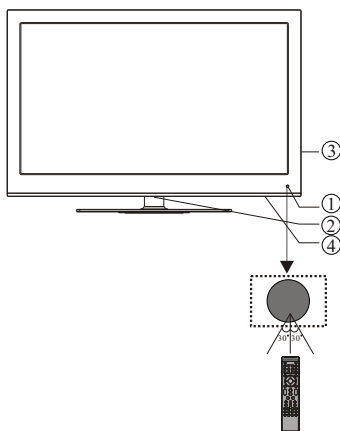
1. Use the screwdriver to remove 4 screws from the screw location.



2. Remove the base stand from the Main body, and store it and the screws somewhere safe for future use.



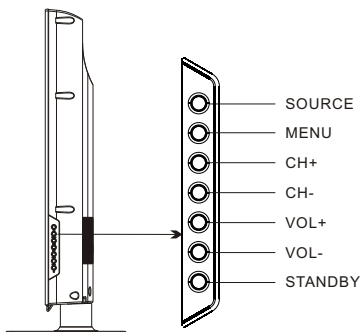
## Front panel



- 1: Remote control sensor.
- 2: Indicator LED:  
BLUE ● = POWER ON.  
RED ● = STANDBY.
- 3: Key board (on side of TV).
- 4: Main power switch (on bottom rear of TV)

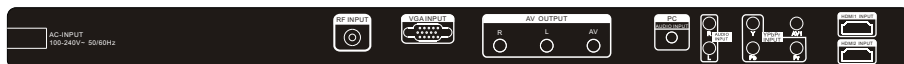
The remote control needs to be pointed directly, within +/- 30°, of the sensor on the front of the TV for reliable operation.

## KEYBOARD



- 1. SOURCE:**  
Displays the input source Menu.
- 2. MENU:**  
Displays the main MENU.
- 3. CH+/CH-**  
In TV mode, press "CH+" or "CH-" to change the channel up and down.  
In MENU mode, press "CH+" or "CH-" to select items.
- 4. VOL+/VOL-**  
Adjusts the sound level.  
In MENU mode, press "VOL+" or "VOL-" to adjust the item that you have selected.
- 5. STANDBY**  
Once the TV's main power switch has been activated, press this button to turn the unit ON from STANDBY mode.  
Press it again to return the set back to STANDBY.

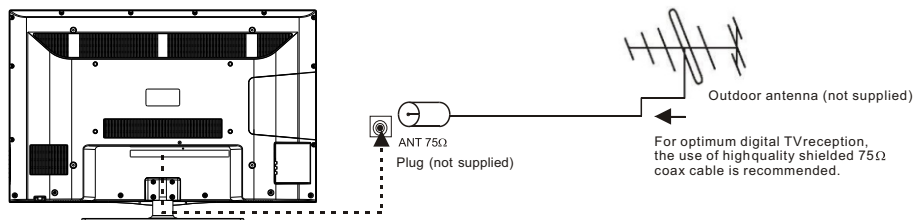
All the terminals are (from left to right):

AC Power input, Antenna socket, VGA input, AV output, PC AUDIO input, Rear Audio input, YPbPr (component video) input, AV1 input, HDMI1 input, HDMI2 input.

Note: 1. AV1 and YPbPr share the Rear Audio input channel.

2. When HDMI1 port receives a DVI signal, the matching audio signal is received by the PC Audio input.

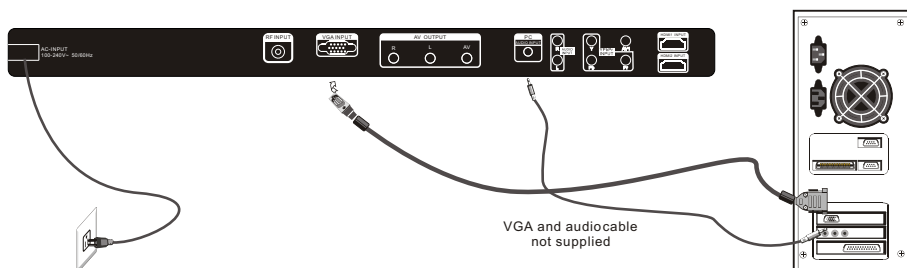

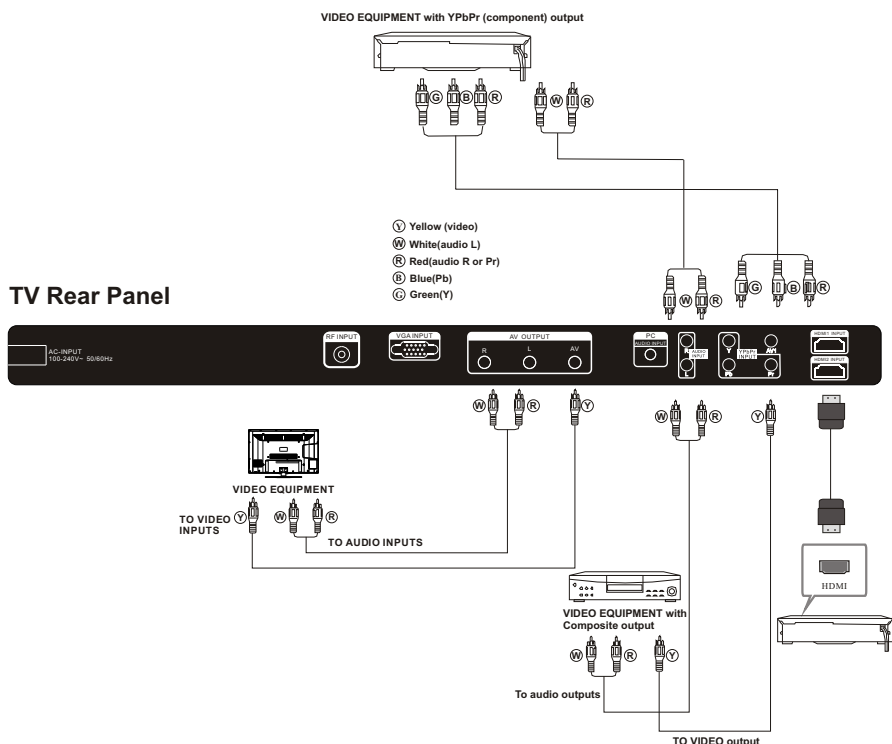

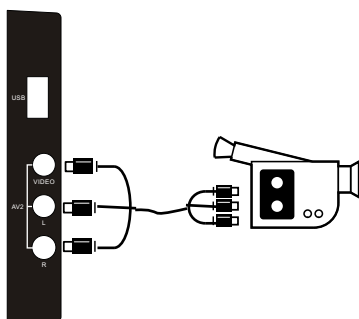
## CONNECTING TO AV EQUIPMENT

This TV provides two group of AV, one group of YPbPr (component video) inputs for convenient connection to VCR, DVD or other video equipment. Please refer to the owner's manual of the equipment to be connected as well.

You can use the input terminals on TV set rear as follows.



## TV Side Panel



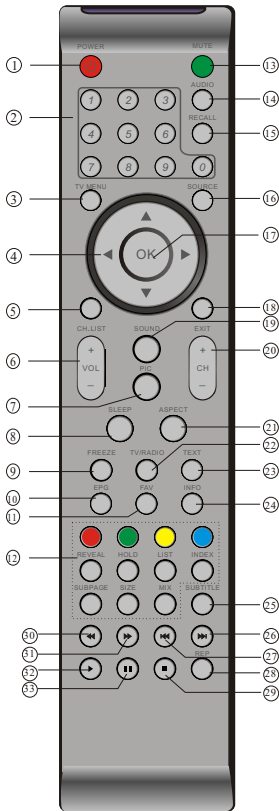
Your TV can be connected to the following appliances: VCR, multi disc player, DVD, camcorder, video game or stereo system, etc.....

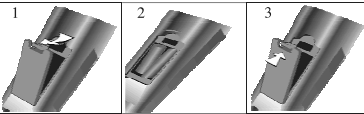
The side panel inputs provide one composite video input, and one pair (stereo) of Audio inputs.

## REMOTE CONTROL



- 1: **POWER**: Press to turn the unit on or off.
- 2: **NUMERIC KEY**: Press for direct access to channels.
- 3: **TV MENU**: Press to display TV Main Menu.
- 4: **CURSOR**: Press to scroll through the Menu.
- 5: **CH. LIST**: Press to display the channel list.
- 6: **VOL +/-**: Press to adjust the sound level.
- 7: **PIC**: Press to switch between picture modes.
- 8: **SLEEP**: Press to set Sleep Timer.
- 9: **FREEZE**: Press to freeze the picture you are watching.
- 10: **EPG**: Press to display the Electronic Program Guide for information on the show you are watching and what's on next in DTV mode.
- 11: **FAV**: Press to access your favourite channels list in ATV or DTV mode.
- 12: **TELETEXT KEYS**: Refer to next page.
- 13: **MUTE**: Press to disable or enable the sound output.
- 14: **AUDIO**: Press to change the available audio /language for the program you are watching.
- 15: **RECALL**: Press to return to the previously viewed channel.
- 16: **SOURCE**: Press to display the Input Source List.
- 17: **OK**: Press to confirm Menu selections.
- 18: **EXIT**: To exit the main menu, press the Exit Button or to cancel setting selections.
- 19: **SOUND**: Press to switch between the sound modes.
- 20: **CH+/CH-**: Press to scroll through your Channel List.
- 21: **ASPECT**: Press to change the picture aspect ratio.
- 22: **TV/RADIO**: Press to switch between TV and Radio modes.
- 23: **TEXT**: Press to enter or exit TELETEXT mode.
- 24: **INFO**: To display the program information of the show you are watching, press the Info Button.
- 25: **SUBTITLE**: To turn on Subtitles press the Subtitle Button in DTV mode.
- 26: **SKIP FORWARD**: Press to skip to the next file or track in USB Mode.
- 27: **SKIP BACKWARD**: Press to skip to the previous file or track in USB Mode.
- 28: **REP**: In USB mode, select Repeat mode.
- 29: **STOP**: Press to Stop play in USB Mode.
- 30: **REWIND**: Fast Reverse Search in USB Mode.
- 31: **FAST FORWARD**: Fast Forward search in USB mode.
- 32: **PLAY**: Press in USB Mode to begin or continue playback.
- 33: **PAUSE**: Press in USB Playback Mode to pause playback.

### Insert Batteries Into the Remote Control



1. Remove the battery cover.
2. Insert the 2 AAA 1.5V batteries making sure the polarity (+ or -) of the batteries matches the polarity marks inside the unit.
3. Mount the battery cover. Replace with new batteries when the TV set begins to show the following symptoms: Operation is unsteady or erratic. Sometimes the TV set does not function with Remote Control Unit.

#### Remark:



- 1) Alkaline batteries are recommended.
- 2) Remove batteries when they are exhausted or if the remote control is not to be used for a long time.

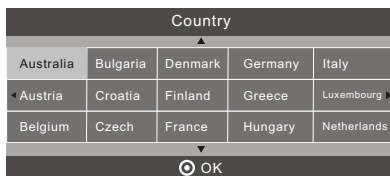

**TELETEXT**

Teletext is an information system broadcast by certain channels which can be consulted like a newspaper. It also offers access to subtitles for viewers with hearing problems or who are not familiar with the transmission language (cable networks, satellite channels, etc.)

Press:	You will obtain:
TEXT	This is used to call or exit teletext modes. The summary appears with a list of items that can be accessed. Each item has a corresponding 3 digit page number. If the channel selected does not broadcast teletext, the indication 100 will be displayed and the screen will remain blank (in this case, exit teletext and select another channel).
SELECTING A PAGE 	Enter the number of the page required using the 0 to 9 up/down. Example: page 120, enter 120. The number is displayed top left, the counter turns and then the page is displayed. Repeat this operation to view another page. If the counter continues to search, this means that the page is not transmitted. Select another number.
DIRECT ACCESS TO THE ITEMS 	Coloured buttons correspond to the colours at the bottom of the screen. The 4 coloured keys are used to access the items or corresponding pages. The coloured areas flash when the item or the page is not yet available.
INDEX	This returns to the contents page (usually page 100).
SUB PAGE	Certain pages contain sub-pages which are automatically displayed successively. This key is used to stop or resume sub-page acquisition. The indication appears top left.
HOLD	To freeze the page.
REVEAL	To display or hide the concealed information (games solutions).
LIST	The user can set four favourite pages to be directly linked to the four color keys. While list mode is activated, it is not possible to use TOP or FLOF navigation with the colour keys. The favourite page numbers should be stored and restored to/from nonvolatile memory for each channel by the system software.

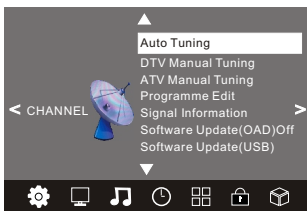
## Installation Guide



This screen only appears when the TV is turned on for the first time, or reset to factory settings. You can choose language, country and auto tuning programs. After tuning, the screen will skip to the first DTV program.

### 1.CHANNEL MENU

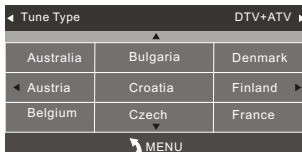
The first item of the MENU is channel menu (for ATV or DTV source only). ATV = Analogue TV, DTV = Digital TV.



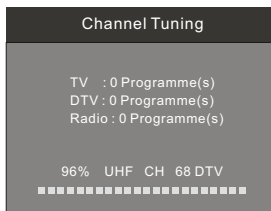
You can search channels and edit programs here.

#### 1).Auto tuning:

Search all the channels automatically (you can select ATV and DTV)



Press ◀▶▼▲ to select country at first, then press the OK button to start auto tuning.



#### NOTE:

All the channels including ATV, DTV and Radio can be tuned at once, if the Tune Type is DTV+ATV. Any previously stored channels will be deleted after auto tuning is carried out.

After auto tuning, the receiver will skip to the first DTV channel.

## 2).DTV Manual tuning:

You can select a DTV channel then find the program in this channel.  
Press ◀▶ to select the channel, then press OK to search the programs .

### NOTE:

The Bad Normal Good bar graph on this screen shows signal intensity.



## 3). ATV Manual tuning :

You can change the sound system, search the analog TV channels and fine tune them, then store the channels you selected.



### NOTE:

Press the teletext red button on the remote control to store the channels after manual tuning.

## 4). Program edit:

You can Delete, Rename, Move, Skip, or FAV any programs.



### Delete

Press the teletext red button, the program in the cursor will be deleted.



### Rename:

You can only rename ATV programs.

Move the cursor to the program, press the teletext green button to rename the program.

Press ▼▲ to choose the character. Press ◀▶ to move the cursor.

Press MENU button to exit edit, Press EXIT to exit the menu.

Note: ATV program names can only be 5 characters long, DTV program names can be up to 25 characters.



### Skip

Press ▼▲ to choose the program, press the teletext blue button to skip this program, the Ⓢ symbol will show on the right side of the program.

Choose the skipped program, press the blue button again, you can cancel the skip and the Ⓢ symbol will disappear.



## Favourite

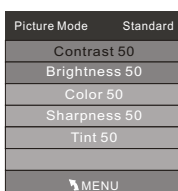
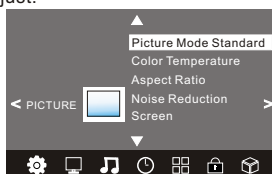
Press ▼▲ to choose the program, press the FAV button and it will show ♥ on the right side of the program. Choose the FAV program, press FAV button again, you can cancel the FAV and ♥ will disappear .

Once your favorite group is created, you can press the FAV key to quickly access your favourite channel.

## 2. PICTURE MENU

The second item of the MENU is PICTURE MENU. You can adjust picture effects here, such as contrast, brightness, etc.

Press ▼▲ to move, press OK to adjust.



### NOTE:

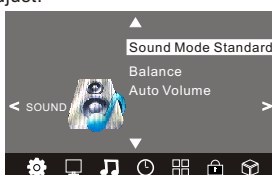
- 1). Tint is available in NTSC system only.
- 2). There are four color temperature modes that can be selected: medium, warm, cool, user.
- 3). The Screen option is only available in PC mode, which allows you to adjust Horizontal position, vertical position, size and phase.

## 3. SOUND MENU

The third item of the MENU is the SOUND MENU.

You can adjust the sound effect here such as treble, bass, balance etc.

Press ▼▲ to move, press OK to adjust.



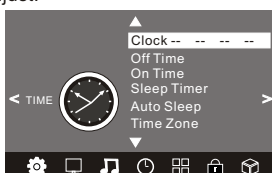
### Note:

Auto volume: only available when the input signal volume is too large or there is distortion.

## 4. TIME MENU

The fourth item of the menu is the TIME MENU. You can adjust the clock, power on/off time, sleep time etc.

Press ▼▲ to move, press OK to adjust.

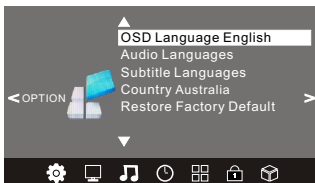


### NOTE:

If within 15 minutes there is no signal, the TV will auto sleep, if Auto Sleep is set ON. The clock time can be set from the DTV system.

## 5.OPTION MENU

To enter the Option Menu, press MENU button and then press ◀ or ▶ buttons to select the Option Menu. Once in Option Menu, press ▼ or ▲ buttons to select the settings you wish to adjust. Press MENU button to return to the Main Menu.



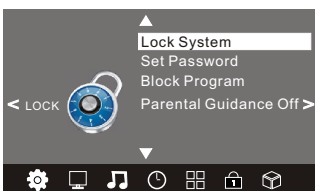

## 6.LOCK MENU

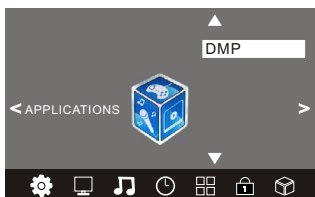
To enter the LOCK Menu, press MENU button and then press ◀ or ▶ buttons to select the LOCK Menu. The default password is 6666.

Please set a new password so it is easy to remember. Follow the onscreen steps to set.

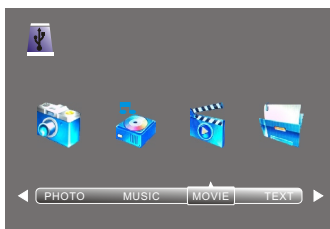


## 7. APPLICATIONS MENU

Press the OK button to enter the DMP Menu.



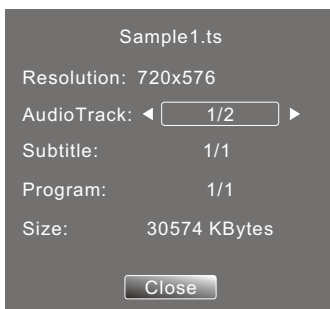



**Subject to the warranty repair conditions below, in addition to all rights and remedies to which you may be entitled under the Competition and Consumer Act 2010 (Commonwealth) and any other relevant legislation, the manufacturer warrants this product to be free from defects in materials or workmanship for a period of 3 years from the original date of purchase.**

## Warranty Repair Conditions

- A. This Product Warranty only applies provided the product:-
- Has been purchased in Australia and sold by Authorised Distributors or Dealers and only where the products are used and serviced within Australia
  - Is taken for service when required to an Authorised Service Agent, together with written instructions indicating specific problem or function requiring investigation,
  - Has valid proof of purchase and presented when warranty service is requested.
  - Has only been used in a domestic application.
  - Has been installed and operated in accordance as noted in the operating instructions under normal use and reasonable care (in the opinion of the Service Centre).
  - Has not been damaged by the use of accessories which in the opinion of the Service Centre are defective or incompatible with the product.
  - Has not been tampered with or repaired (including unauthorised alterations) by anyone other than the AWA Service Centre or an Authorised Service Centre.
- B. This Product Warranty does not cover:-
- Damage, malfunction or failure resulting from use of incorrect voltages, incorrect installation, accidental damage, misuse, neglect, build-up of dirt or dust abuse, wear and tear, maladjustment of customer controls, mains supply problems, thunderstorm activity or Acts of God, pixel error, infestation by insects or vermin, exposure to abnormally corrosive conditions or any foreign object or matter having entered the product.
  - Mileage or travelling time in respect of service outside the authorised AWA Service Centre nor pick up and delivery cost incurred.
