










PRECAUTIONS



- The apparatus shall not be exposed to dripping or splashing.
- Do not use where there are extremes of temperature (below 5°C or exceeding 35°C) or where direct sunlight may strike it.
- Because of the DVD player's extremely low noise and wide dynamic range, there might be a tendency to set the volume on the amplifier unnecessarily high. Doing so may produce an excessively large output from the amplifier which could damage your speakers.
- Sudden changes in the ambient temperature may cause condensation to form on the optical lens inside the unit. If this happens, take out the disc, leave the unit for about 1 hour, and then proceed to operate.
- When carrying the unit, be sure to remove a disc which may be inside and turn the power off. Wait at least 10 seconds, then unplug the mains lead from the AC outlet. Carrying the unit with a disc inside may damage the disc and/or the unit.
- Do not install this equipment in a confined space, such as a book case or built in cabinet.
- The DVD player is not completely disconnected from the mains when the d/ON button is set to the d position.
- The player is set to the standby mode automatically after approximately 30 minutes have elapsed under the complete stop mode.


Important Information:

To connect this DVD player to a TV, TV must have a set of Audio/Video composite input sockets. You cannot use an RF input socket or aerial terminal to connect this DVD player.


Inserting batteries

Install two "AA/R6/SUM-3" batteries (not supplied).



Remove the batteries if the remote control is not to be used for a month or more. Batteries left in the unit may leak and cause damage.

CONNECTIONS

Selecting TV system


Before connecting, be sure the TV SYSTEM switch (rear of the unit) setting corresponds with your local TV system (PAL or NTSC).

Note:


- Do not connect the DVD player to a VCR directly. The playback picture will be distorted because DVD discs are copy protected.
- When you connect the DVD player to your TV and other equipment, be sure to turn off the power and disconnect all of the equipments from the wall outlet until all the connections have been made.
- Please refer to the instruction manuals for the components that you are connecting (TV, AV amplifier, etc.).

Connecting to a TV with the Audio/Video cable

This is the easiest way to hook up the DVD player.



Connecting to a TV with an Audio and S-video cables



If your TV has a S-video input socket, connect the DVD player as shown in figure. (The VIDEO OUT socket connection is not necessary.) You can enjoy clearer picture playback.

Connecting to a HiFi system with analog twochannel stereo sound


Connect an audio cable (not supplied) to the AUDIO OUT sockets of the DVD player and to the appropriate sockets of the HiFi system.

 The AUDIO OUT sockets can also be used for connection to an AV system with Dolby Pro Logic decoder.

Note:

To enjoy Dolby Pro Logic sound, select "DOLBY DIGITAL: LPCM" in "Digital out" under "INITIAL SETTINGS". (See Page 14.)

Connecting to a digital multi-channel AV amplifier



The digital multi-channel sound of a DVD can best be decoded and played with a multi-channel AV amplifier (Dolby Digital decoder or MPEG2 decoder).

The AV amplifier has to be able to process the DTS audio signal in order to play a DVD with DTS. If it cannot, then you will not be able to hear the DVD.

Note:

- To enjoy Dolby Digital sound, select "DOLBY DIGITAL: BITSTREAM" in "Digital out" under "INITIAL SETTINGS". (See Page 14.)
- To enjoy MPEG2 sound, select "MPEG: BITSTREAM" in "Digital out" under "INITIAL SETTINGS".
- To enjoy DTS sound, select "DTS: ON" in "Digital out" under "INITIAL SETTINGS".

There is a region number on the rear of the unit.

The same region number or region number "ALL" of DVD discs can be used on this unit.

Region number

DVD discs are divided into titles, and the titles are sub-divided into chapters.

Video CD/Music CD disc

Video CD and Music CD discs are divided into tracks.

Note:

- Only the above types of discs can be played on this unit.
 DVD-ROM, CD-ROM, SVCD, CVD, etc. cannot be played.
- This unit can play back the CD-R/RW that have recorded music data or MP3 files as well. However, some CD-R/RWs can not be played back depending on the recording conditions.
- The CD-R/RW that has no music data or non-MP3 files can not be played back.
- This unit is to be used exclusively with the PAL or NTSC colour system. SECAM system discs cannot be used with this unit.

Notes on handling discs

- Do not expose the disc to direct sunlight, high humidity or high temperatures for extended periods of time.
- Discs should be returned to their cases after use.
- Do not apply paper or write anything on the disc surface.
- Handle the disc by its edge. Do not touch the playing surface (glossy side)
- Fingerprints and dust should be carefully wiped off the playing surface of the disc with a soft cloth.
 - Wipe in a straight motion from the centre to the outside of the disc.
- Never use chemicals such as record cleaning sprays, antistatic sprays or fluids, benzene or thinner to clean discs.

BASIC OPERATION

Important note:

- This instruction manual explains the basic instruction of this DVD player using the remote control unit.
- Some DVD or Video CD discs have different functions that may not be explained in this instruction manual. You may be needed extra instructions. In this case, please follow the instructions displayed on the TV screen or jacket or case of the disc.
 - " O" may appear on the TV screen during operation. This icon means that the function is not available on the disc now.

Preparations

- Turn on the TV and select the channel for the DVD player.
 Select the playback picture size according to the aspect ratio of the TV. (See "Display" under "INITIAL SETTINGS" on Page 13.)
- Turn on the HiFi system, AV amplifier, etc. and select the audio input for the DVD player.

Note:

- Do not touch the disc tray while it is moving.
- Never place anything except a disc on the disc tray. Foreign objects can damage the unit.
- Do not apply excessive force to the disc tray.
- Discs must be placed on the disc tray one at a time.
- To open or close the disc tray, be sure to use the ≜ button (Main unit).
 Do not press the disc tray with your hand.

When operation buttons are pressed, that operation is displayed on the TV screen. The display turns off after several seconds.

- 1. Press the &ON button.
 - The STANDBY indicator turns off and the DVD player turns on.
 - "SANYO" logo appears on the TV screen.
 - "NO DISC" appears on the display.
- 2. Press the ≜ button.
 - "OPEN" appears on the display and the disc tray opens.
- 3. Place the disc with the label facing up on the disc tray.





- Press the ≜ button again to close the disc tray.
 - "READING" appears on the display.

Note:

Some discs may start play automatically.

Starting play

Press the PLAY button.

Example:



Note:

If the disc is loaded with the label side downward (and it is a single sided disc), or if a badly scratched disc is loaded, "NO DISC" (or "NO PLAY") appears. If this occurs, load the disc correctly or replace the disc.

If a menu appears on the TV screen...

Press the ▲, ▶, ▼ or ◀ button (or the number buttons), then press the ENT button to select the desired menu. Playback of the selected menu will start. Note:

For more details, please refer to the jacket or case of the disc.

Stopping play

- Press the ■ button once.

When you press the ► PLAY button, play starts automatically from the point where you stopped.

Note:

Some discs may not resume play.

Press the ■ button twice. The player stops completely.
 When you press the ► PLAY button, play starts from the beginning of the disc.

To turn the power off, press the 也/ON button again. The STANDBY indicator lights.

Continuing play from where you stopped watching (LAST MEMORY PLAY) [DVD]

- During play, press the LAST MEMO button at the point from which you want to resume play later. "L.M." appears on the display. Play stops automatically.
- 2. Remove the disc or turn off the power.
- Load the disc (and press the ► PLAY button), or turn on the power. "Last Memory Play?" screen appears.

Last Memory Play?

Clear ... The memory is released.

- Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select "Yes".
- Press the ENT button. Play resumes from the point where you stopped. (If desired, press the LAST MEMO button again.)

Note:

- Points on up to 5 discs can be memorized.
- The Last Memory Play mode may not work correctly with some discs.

What is "PBC"?

"PBC" is an abbreviation for "Playback Control" that refers to control codes prerecorded on Video CDs.

During playback of Video CD with PBC, "PBC" appears on the display.

To lock the disc tray

You can lock the disc tray to prevent misuse of young children. While the disc tray is opened, press the ≜ button until "LOCKED" appears on the display.

The ≜ button will not function.

To release this mode, press the ≜ button until "UNLOCKED" appears.

VARIOUS PLAYING FUNCTIONS

"O" may appear on the TV screen during operation. This icon means that the function is not available on the disc now.

Chapter (Track) skip



Skipping forward

Press the NEXT ▶▶I button during play to skip to the next chapter (or track). A chapter (or track) is skipped each time the button is pressed.

Skipping back

Press the PREV I◄◀ button during play to skip back to the beginning of the chapter (or track) currently play. Press the button again immediately to skip back to the beginning of the previous chapter (or track).

Note:

You can skip only through the chapters, not over the title on the DVD disc.

Title search [DVD]

 Press the SEARCH MODE button once during play or in the stop mode. "TITLE SEARCH..." screen appears.

2. Press the number button(s) to enter the title number. The selected title playback starts.

Example:

To select No. 3, press 3.

To select No. 10, press +10, then 0.

To select No. 24, press +10, +10, then 4.

Chapter search [DVD]

 Press the SEARCH MODE button twice during play. "CHAPTER SEARCH..." screen appears.

Press the number button(s) to enter the chapter number. The selected chapter playback starts.

Track search [Video CD] [CD]

Press the number button(s) during play or in the stop mode. Play starts from the selected track.

Time search

[DVD]

 Press the SEARCH MODE button three times during play. "TIME SEARCH..." screen appears.

Press the number button(s) to enter the time.

Example:

20 minutes 5 seconds

Press 2, 0, 0 then 5.

1 hour 4 minutes 35 seconds

Press 1, 0, 4, 3 then 5.

Note:

Do not use the +10 button.

- If you made a mistake, press the CLEAR button.

Press the ► PLAY button. Play starts from the searched time.

[Video CD] [CD]

 Press the SEARCH MODE button once during play. "TIME SEARCH..." screen appears.

2. Press the number button(s) to enter the time.

 Press the ► PLAY button. Play starts from the searched time in the selected track.

Note:

By repeating steps 1 - 3 in the stop mode, play starts at the searched time in the disc.

Fast play

Press the ►► FWD or ◄◄ REV button repeatedly to select the fast speed forward or reverse play.

[DVD] [Video CD]

"FF1 ►►", "FF2 ►►", "FF3 ►►" or "FR1 ◄◄", "FR2 ◄◄", "FR3 ◄◄"

Press the ► PLAY button to return to normal play.

Slow-motion play

[DVD] [Video CD]: Forward slow play, [DVD]: Reverse slow play Press the FWD SLOW ▶ or REV SLOW ◄ button repeatedly to select the forward or reverse slow speed play.

"SF1 I►", "SF2 I►", "SF3 I►" or "SR1 ◄1", "SR2 ◄1", "SR3 ◄1" Press the ► PLAY button to return to normal play.

Note

The sound is muted during fast play or slow-motion play in DVD and Video CD.

Still picture (Pause)

[DVD] [Video CD]: Still picture mode, [CD]: Pause mode
Press the ■ PAUSE/STEP button during play. "It" appears on the display.
Press the ► PLAY button to resume normal play.

Note: The sound is muted.

Frame by frame advance play [DVD] [Video CD]

Press the II PAUSE/STEP button during still play. Each time the button is pressed, the picture advances one frame.

Press the ► PLAY button to resume normal play.

Note:

- The sound is muted.

Frame play is operated forward only.

Zoom feature [DVD] [Video CD]

1. Press the ZOOM button during normal, slow or still play. The central part of the picture is magnified.




 Each time you press the ZOOM or RETURN button, the picture zooms in or out ("Zoom +15" ~ "Zoom -15").

 Each time you press the ▲, ▶, ▼ or ◄ button, the picture moves from side to side, up and down.

2. To return to normal, slow or still play, press the CLEAR button. Note:

Some discs may not work Zoom feature.

Viewing from a desired camera angle (Multi-Angle)



Some DVD discs may contain scenes which have been shot simultaneously from a number of different camera angles. The jacket or case of discs that are recorded with angles will be marked.

Example:



Note: The recorded angles differ depending on the disc used.

- 1. Play the disc that is recorded with angles.
- Press the ANGLE button repeatedly until the desired angle appears. Example:



Angle replay [DVD]

During Multi-angle play screen, press the ANGLE REPLAY button. The player skips back to last approximately 10 seconds, changes it to the next camera angle and plays it, and continues play. (If desired, press the button again.)

Normal repeat play

Press the REPEAT button during play (or programmed play) of the title (or track) you want to repeat.

Each time the button is pressed, the repeat mode changes as follows.

IDVDI

Title (REP. 1): Repeat of title being played

Grand Off: Normal play mode


[Video CD] [CD]

T 1 (REP. 1): Repeat of track being played

All (REP. ALL): Repeat all tracks

Grant Off: Normal play mode

Designated range repeat play (A-B Repeat)



- Press the A-B REPEAT button during play at the beginning of the section you want to repeat (Point A). "A-" appears on the screen. "REP. A-B" blinks on the display.
- Press the A-B REPEAT button again at the end of the section (Point B). "REP. A-B" remains lit on the display.

The section between points A and B is played repeatedly.

For Video CD, wait 2 seconds at least before pressing the button.

To return to normal play, press the A-B REPEAT button again.

Note:

Normal repeat play or A-B repeat play mode may not work correctly with some discs.

Return button (RETURN) for Video CD

Normally, it returns to the previous menu during play when the RETURN button is pressed.

Note:

The operation differs according to the content of the Video CD.

Programmed play [Video CD] [CD]

Up to 32 selections can be programmed.

Programming procedure

- Press the PROGRAM button in the stop mode. "PROGRAM" screen appears. "PROG." blinks and "Pr. 1" appears on the display.
- Press the number button(s) to select the track number. Example:

To select track No.3, press 3.

To select track No.10, press 1, then 0.

To select track No.24, press 2, then 4.

Note:

- If you made a mistake, press the CLEAR button.
- Do not use the +10 button.
- Press the PROGRAM button to guit this menu.
- Press the ENT button. The highlighted box automatically moves to the next programme number.

Example:

PROG	RAM

		Total programed time

- Repeat step 2 3 above to select another track.
- Press the PLAY button to start play. "PROG." remains lit.
 When all programmed selections have played, the player stops automatically.
 - The programme contents are retained in memory.

To clear the programme one by one

In the programming mode, press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the programme number. Then press the CLEAR button.

To clear all the programmes

In the programming mode, press the ■ button.

To change the programme

- In the programming mode, press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the programme number.
- 2. Press the number button(s) to select the track umber to be replaced.
- Press the ENT button.

To use the programme again with the same contents

Press the PROGRAM button. The previous programme contents appears on the screen. Then press the ▶ PLAY button.

Selecting a title menu [DVD]

Press the TITLE button. The title menu appears.
Note:

Press the TITLE button again to resume play from the scene when the TITLE button was first pressed.

2. Press the ▲, ▶, ▼ or ◄ button (or the number buttons) to select the desired title then press the ENT button. The selected title play starts.

Selecting a DVD menu [DVD]

Press the MENU button. The main menu screen appears.
 Note:

Press the MENU button again to resume play.

 Press the A, ►, ▼ or ◄ button (or the number buttons) to select the desired menu then press the ENT button. The selected menu play starts.


Note:

- The selecting a title menu or a DVD menu operation may differ depending on the disc used.
- Selecting a title menu or a DVD menu may not be possible on some discs.

Selecting subtitle language [DVD]

This operation works only with discs on which multiple subtitle languages are recorded.

- Press the SUBTITLE button during play. "SUBTITLE CHANGE" screen appears.
- Press the ▲ button to select "On". The language is highlighted.
 Example:



Press the ➤ or ■ button to select the desired subtitle language then
press the SUBTITLE button.

Note:

- In some cases, the subtitle language is not changed to the selected
- When a disc supporting the closed caption is played, the subtitle and the closed caption may overlap each other on the TV screen. In this case, turn the subtitle off.
- When the desired language is not selected even if the button is pressed, the language is not available on the disc.
- When the power is turned on or the disc is replaced, select the subtitle language again.
- If the subtitle language is not necessary, select "Off".

Selecting audio soundtrack language (Multi-Language) [DVD]

This operation works only with discs on which multiple audio soundtrack languages are recorded.



1. Press the AUDIO button during play.

 Press the AUDIO button repeatedly until the desired language appears on the screen.

Example:

AUDIO CHANGE 04 FRENCH

Note:

- When the desired language is not selected even if the button is pressed, the language is not available on the disc.
- When the power is turned on or the disc is replaced, select the language again.
- If the language is not recorded on the disc, only the available language on the disc will be heard.

Changing the audio channel output [Video CD]

During Video CD play, press the AUDIO button to select an audio channel. LEFT MONO (L) —— RIGHT MONO (R) —— STEREO —— LEFT MONO (L) ...

Note: You cannot change an audio channel from the optical DIGITAL OUT socket.

Selecting on-screen information

1

Press the ON SCREEN button repeatedly to show the disc information (Title, Chapter, Title elapsed playing time, Language, etc.).

Example for DVD:








The ▲ or ▼ button can be used only on the active screen while "ON SCREEN" is working.

Camera angle


Example for VCD:

1. Press the ON SCREEN button.





By pressing the ▲ or ▼ button, the track or disc information changes. Disc remaining playing time

For Music CD, please refer to "Example for VCD" as above.

Selecting picture mode [DVD] [Video CD]

Press the PICTURE MODE button. Each time the button is pressed, the picture mode changes as follows:

PICTURE MODE

Standard → Bright → Mild → Black and White → Standard ...

Multi-vision screen [DVD]

- 1. Press the MULTI-VISION button during play, pause or search mode.
 - The normal screen changes to 9-picture screen.
 - The sound is muted.
- 2. Press the MULTI-VISION button again to return normal screen.

Selecting surround sound mode [DVD]

Press the SURROUND button repeatedly to show your desired surround mode. "SURR." appears on the display. Each time the button is pressed, the surround mode changes as follows.

VIRTUAL SURROUND

Action - Drama - Theater - Off - Action ...

It works with Dolby Digital or Dolby Surround of DVD discs.

MP3 CD OPERATION

This player can play back the CD-R/RW that have recorded music data or MP3 files. Before playing back MP3 CD, please read the following.

MP3 CD information.

Limitations on MP3 CD play

- This player can recognize up to 255 files or folders per disc. The CD with 256 files or folders and over is not available to this player.
- This player can recognize up to 8 directory trees per disc.
- MP3 CD may not be played in the recorded order.
- As for multi-session disc, only the first session can be played.
- If the CD has both audio tracks and MP3 files, only audio tracks are played.
- It would take 30 seconds or more for this player to read MP3 files depending on its structure.

Limitations on display

- The maximum number for display is 33 letters. Available letters for display are the following: capital or small alphabets of A through Z, numbers of 0 through 9, and _ (underline).
- Other letters than those above are replaced in blank.

Notes on MP3 files

- The recommend recording setting for a high-quality sound is 44.1 kHz of sampling frequency and 128kbps of fixing bit rate.
- To play MP3 CD in the recorded order,
 - Please use the MP3 software with the function that can record data alphabetically or numerically.
 - 2. Put the name including two-digit or three-digit number like "01" "02" or "001" "002" on each file.
 - 3. Please refrain from making many sub-folders by preference.
- Some MP3 CDs can not be played back depending on the recording conditions.

MP3 CD Play

1. Lord the MP3 CD.

A table of contents in the root directory appears on the TV screen.


Note

If nothing appears on the TV screen, press the MENU button.

- Select the desired file by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button. The selected file is highlighted.
 - To go on to the next directory, select the appropriate folder and press the ► button. A table of contents in the selected directory appears on the TV screen.
 - To go back to the previous directory, press the ◀ button.
 - You can go on up to the eighth directory.

Press the ENT (or ► PLAY) button to start playback.
 Elapsed playing time and total playing time in current file are displayed
 on the TV screen.

Notes on file skip

Skipping forward

Press the NEXT ▶▶I button during play to skip to the next file. Each time the button is pressed, a file is skipped within the same directory.

Skipping back

Press the PREV I◄◀ button during play to skip back to the beginning of the file currently play. Press the button again immediately to skip back to the beginning of the previous file.

Note:

- The files with no-MP3 extension and the folders are automatically skinned
- To roll up and down the display, press the ▲ and ▼ buttons respectively.

NITIALSTITINGS

Once the initial settings have been completed, the player can always be operated under the same conditions. The settings will be retained in the memory until they are changed, even if the power is turned off,

Common procedures of initial settings

1. Press the SET UP button in the stop mode. "SET UP MENU" appears on the TV screen.









- Press the ▲, ▶, ▼ or ◀ button, then press the ENT button to select the menu. Please refer to the on-screen instructions.
- 3. Press the SET UP button to quit this menu.



When the wide screen disc is played back, it displays pictures cropped to fill to your TV screen. The left and right edges are cut off.

16:9:

Select when a wide screen TV set is connected. Played in "FULL" size. (Setting the wide screen TV to "FULL" mode is also necessary.)







Note:

- The screen size may differ depending on the DVD discs.
- If you select 16:9 to get rid of the black bands on screen when wide screen disc is played back, picture may be slightly distorted.
- In some discs, even if 4.3 PS is selected, the black bands will remain on the screen.

MPAA (Motion Picture Association of America) Guideline is rating system that provide advance cautionary information to parent about the content of movie programmes.

The parental lock level is equivalent to the following MPAA Rating System.

Level 7: NC-17 (No one 17 and under admitted)

Level 6: R (Restricted)

Level 4: PG13 (Parental guidance cautioned)

Level 3: PG (Parental guidance suggested)

Level 1: G (General audiences)

Some DVD discs contain a restriction level which enables parents to prevent playback of discs by children. This DVD player is equipped with a password designed to prevent children changing the level.

You cannot play DVD discs rated higher than the level you selected unless you cancel the parental lock function.

For example, when you select level "5", the DVD player will not play discs with ratings of "6", "7" or "8". The information will appear on the TV screen.

If you forget the password...

Enter "788444" to clear the current password.

Enter a new password and set the parental lock level again.

Note:

DVD discs may or may not respond to the parental lock settings. Make sure this function works with your DVD discs.

For improvement, on screen displays subject to change without notice.

CLEANING THE UNIT
